- ▶ In addition to current credit requirements, students will have to show proficiency in both **MATH** and **ENGLISH LANGUAGE ARTS**.
- ▶ Most students will fulfill this requirement by taking the SAT in April of their junior year.

# Graduation Requirements

- ▶ **50 TOTAL CREDITS ARE REQUIRED**
  - ▶ If a student takes full credit classes, they could earn 16 credits per year.
    - ▶ That is potentially 64 credits at graduation.

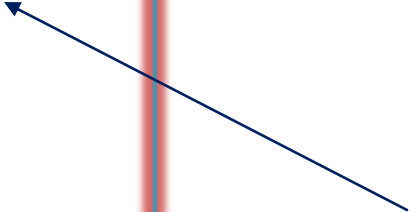

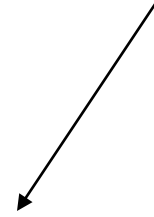

### Helpful hints and tips to a successful schedule selection

- To participate in athletics and activities, you must always carry 5 full-credit courses. (Attendance Waivers and Guided Study Halls DO NOT COUNT TOWARD ATHLETIC OR ACTIVITY ELIGIBILITY).
- Be sure to check if there is a prerequisite required before selecting any course. If it is a year-long course, be sure to enter both the "A" and "B" numbers into Infinite Campus (for example: Drafting 1 is 103025A for semester 1 and 103025B for semester 2). **See the online curriculum guide for descriptions.**
- Use this worksheet, the credit check worksheet at the back of the curriculum guide and the online curriculum guide to help you select and write in your choices before entering them into Infinite Campus.

# Entering Requests

- ▶ Many of the **required classes** for 9<sup>th</sup> grade will be entered automatically for students including:
  - ▶ *English, Math, Intro to PE, Health, Biology, Civics, World Geo, World Language and Study Hall*
  - ▶ *Students will need to enter 2 Elective requests*
    - ▶ *1 yearlong or 2 semester long*
  - ▶ **Add Alternates**
    - ▶ *Add up to 4 alternates in case we are unable to meet your first choices*

### ART 1 (this course fulfills the MYP Art requirement) Course 020000
