- MOST OF YOU WILL FULFILL THIS REQUIREMENT BY TAKING THE SAT YOUR JUNIOR YEAR (IN APRIL). AS MORE INFORMATION BECOMES AVAILABLE FROM THE COLORADO STATE BOARD OF EDUCATION, IT WILL BE ANNOUNCED TO YOU AND YOUR FAMILIES.

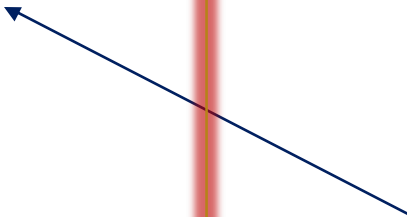

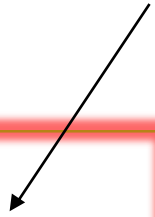

At the end of your 10th grade year, most of you will have approximately 30-32 of the required graduation credit requirements. If you failed class(es), you'll need to meet with me to talk about course recovery (summer school is a good option) and planning your schedule for next year.

*Each student will look different depending on what electives and programs like band, choir or AVID they enroll in.

Registration will be slightly different this year.
We'll go through the steps in the next slides.

General Information:

- Log in to your IC Account
 - Stay in your 11th grade lane for next year's scheduling!
 - Drop down menu in each section
 - Elective classes may be located under fine art, unrestricted elective, or core
 - You may select a study hall or TA (Student Assistant) each semester -You'll be paired with a teacher in the fall
 - If you are on track for graduation, you may select one attendance waiver each semester (a partial)
 - Select classes based on your ICAP and postsecondary plans/ideas!
 - Make sure you have completed your 10th grade tasks for ICAP in Naviance!


