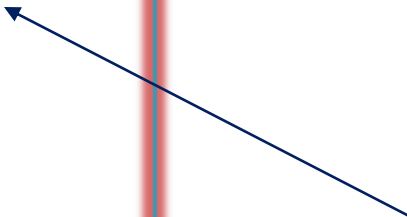

# How to Register! General Info...

*If you are applying to ROTC career start or concurrent enrollment, you will register as if you are not in the program. Once you are accepted we will put your schedule in by hand.*

## ▶ Log in to your IC Account

- ▶ You should be able to see the classes that you have already taken.
- ▶ Stay in your 12<sup>th</sup> grade lane for next year's scheduling!
- ▶ Drop down menu in each section
- ▶ Elective classes may be located under fine art, unrestricted elective, or core - *when in doubt check the course guide on our website*
- ▶ Attendance waivers - **Only if you are on track for graduation,**
  - ▶ 1 waiver in the 1<sup>st</sup> semester and 2 waivers for the 2<sup>nd</sup> semester - You will request it under "non credit"
- ▶ Make sure to select both semesters of study hall
- ▶ You will need to make sure your requests total 12
- ▶ Make sure to have 3-4 alternatives - put them in order of your 1<sup>st</sup> choice and so on.
- ▶ When requesting Band or Choir - register for Concert Band or Concert Choir. The directors will be working with us for your placements.

# Looking Ahead...

- ▶ **Be sure that you have requested the classes you need for graduation as well as the college admission requirements.**
  - ▶ If you are trying to decide from multiple college aim to the highest requirement.
    - ▶ If one college wants 2 years of a world language, but a different 1 wants 1 year, make sure you have 2 years completed.
- ▶ **Colleges and prospective employers want to see that you are pushing yourself academically. So don't sign up for just electives.**
  - ▶ You will need to send your schedule and fall transcripts and they will see what classes you are taking.
  - ▶ Also some employers will ask for your transcripts and will hire based on your transcripts and performance.

# More to keep in mind...

- ▶ **SAT** –Remember if you want to take the essay portion of the SAT in April register for it on college board.
- ▶ Start putting together your “brag sheet” or also known as your letter of recommendation profile so that you have put together your accomplishments and highlights so that you can give that to whom you want a letter of rec from.
  - ▶ You can get this form down in counseling

# Ranking and GPA

- ▶ Class rank is calculated on weighted GPA which is computed from final semester grades.
- ▶ Final class rank is based on eight semesters.
- ▶ IB students are ranked within the context of the entire graduating class. The balance of the graduating class is then ranked exclusive of the IB students.

# Valedictorian and Salutatorian

- ▶ Rampart High School has a Valedictorian and Salutatorian for both IB and College Preparatory students.
- ▶ The Valedictorian(s) will be the student(s) with the highest grade point average in the graduation class within the above groups.
- ▶ Salutatorians have the second highest GPA in each group.
- ▶ Valedictorian(s) will speak at graduation.
- ▶ *If a student moves out of the The International Baccalaureate Diploma Programme (IBDP), during his/her junior or senior year, he/she is not eligible for Valedictorian or Salutatorian.*

# Naviance

- ▶ Make sure you go into Naviance and complete your tasks for Grade 11
  - ▶ If you don't we will be calling your down to counseling later this year to complete those. Please save us both the efforts of this and go in and finish those.
- ▶ Know your deadlines for your college applications. Put these into your calendar and plan ahead. **If you are late to a deadline that doesn't make your emergency our emergency.**
- ▶ All transcripts requests are made through Naviance. We will go through the process at the beginning of the year.
- ▶ When you apply to a college they will send you a transcript request form. Do not bring that to counseling, just make the request through Naviance.
